Presidio Jogger Dies; Search On For Hit-And Run Driver A young woman, who was run down by a hit-and-run driver as she jogged along a tree-lined road in the San Francisco's Presidio, has died after she was removed from life support, her family website reported Monday.

Ashlyn Dyer, 27, was found by a Presidio worker at around 7 a.m. March 2 lying in a ditch next to a roadway on Washington Boulevard near Kobbe Ave. She suffered irreversible brain damage caused by a lack of oxygen for a period of probably greater than 10 minutes from the time she was hit until paramedics arrived, the website stated.

"After 27 years of happiness, love, laughter and true spirit, Ashlyn passed peacefully at 4:23 p.m. (Sunday). Doctors were able to harvest all healthy organs which will provide the gift of life to many," according to the family's posting.

Dyer was unconscious when she was discovered and never regained consciousness. SF investigators stopped cars in the Presidio the day after Dwyer was discovered in the hopes of finding anyone who had seen her.

But it was to no avail.

The driver remains at large and could be facing vehicular manslaughter charges.
